Section C-2 Section Officer Responsibilities 2021-2022

ATTENDANCE

- Officers of Section C-2 are expected to attend all Council of Chiefs meetings, Officers meetings, the Section Conclave, the region Section Officers Seminar, and NOAC (if applicable).
- The Section Chief is expected to attend the annual national meeting in December.
- Officers are encouraged to attend as many functions of C-2 Lodges as possible during the year. These are opportunities to strengthen bonds between the lodges within the section.
- Officers are expected to remain active members of their home chapter and lodge, and attend the functions of their own lodge as an active participant.
- Officers are expected to remain active in their home unit.
- Officers must be able to provide their own transportation to all events.

UNIFORMING

- Officers of Section C-2 are expected to be in proper, clean Uniform whenever representing the Section and/or the Order of the Arrow.
- Uniform patches should be correctly placed according to the Uniform Guidebook.

DUTIES

- Most duties are found in the Field Operations Guide in chapter 2 rule III and rule IV; a copy can be found at <https://oa-bsa.org/uploads/publications/FOG-202101.pdf>. Specific duties may be assigned by either the Section Chief or the Council of Chiefs throughout the year.
- All officers are expected to communicate with the Section Adviser and Chief on a weekly basis throughout the program year.
- Officers are expected to stay within their budget, and to submit payment requisitions to the Section Adviser in a timely fashion.

COMMITMENT

- Being a Section Officer is a **large** commitment. It involves a significant amount of time, energy, and travel to do the job correctly.
- Scouting activities are secondary to family, church, and school responsibilities.
- Therefore, if your present responsibilities are time demanding, then you need to re-think where the OA fits into your life **before deciding to run for section office**.
- An officer of Section C-2 may not serve simultaneously as a lodge chief and it is strongly recommended that you not serve as a lodge officer at all. Therefore, if you have any intention of running for Lodge Chief, please discuss this with your Lodge Advisor and decide whether you can best serve the OA at this time in the Lodge or Section.
